 know. Encourage them to colorfully illustrate with details!

Reading Aloud Tips

Reading Aloud is one of the most important things parents can do with their children. Reading Aloud is a conversation between you, your child, and the story. You'll be asking questions, introducing rich new words, providing a model of fluent, expressive reading, and letting your child know how wonderful books and reading can be.

1. Make Connections!

When children connect what they already know to what they read, it helps them focus. Show your child how to make connections when you read aloud. If a book mentions places you've been to with your child, talk about those memories. Then have your child give it a try.

2. Ask Questions As You Read!

Ask questions about what is happening in the illustrations. Why a character might feel a certain way, or what you think will happen next. You can also ask your child to take turns being the detective and asking you questions. Asking questions encourages children to look for clues in the text. Ask questions to spark your child's curiosity -"How is that character feeling?"

3. Look for Clues!

When you combine what you already know with clues from a story, you can make guesses or predictions. These are inferences. And making them is a great way to build reading comprehension. For example, when we read "Jan's eyes were red and her nose was runny," we can infer that Jan has a cold or allergies. Help your child do this as you read. If a character is wearing gym clothes and sweating, ask your child what the character might have been doing before.



4. What Is Important?

Ask your child: Who are the main characters? Where is the setting? What's the most important thing that has happened in the story so far? What problem are the characters trying to solve? When kids can point out what's important, they're more likely to understand what they read.

5. Check For Understanding.

It helps to encourage kids to stop and ask themselves, "Is this making sense?" If your child gets stuck, suggest rereading the part that didn't make sense. What about it was confusing? Were there specific words that tripped your child up?

6. After Reading You Can Ask...

- What was your favorite part? Why?
- Who was your favorite character? Why?
- What was the most interesting thing you learned? Why?
- Why do you think the author wrote this book?
- Would you have ended the book differently? Did it end the way you thought it would?
- If you could change one thing in the book, what would it be?
- Can you make up a different ending to this story?



Benefits of Reading Aloud

Boosts Early Literacy Skills

Studies have shown that children who are read to regularly are more likely to develop early literacy skills, such as rhyming, letter recognition, and phonemic awareness (hearing the sounds in spoken words). These skills are essential for becoming a skilled reader while achieving success in school

Helps Children Develop Language and Literacy Skills

Books provide rich language experiences and expose children to **vocabulary** not used as often in everyday spoken conversation. When children hear new words and phrases, it helps them expand their "word bank" and learn how to use language effectively. Reading aloud helps children understand **text structure**— how a narrative story is pieced together, with a beginning, middle, and end. Reading aloud also helps children develop additional **comprehension** skills, such as inferencing, predicting, and understanding characters' actions and motivations.

Builds Background Knowledge

When you read all different kinds of books with your child — fiction, poetry, fantasy, science fiction, historical fiction, biography, narrative nonfiction, and informational texts — you help them develop a better understanding of the world around them. As you read, keep the dialogue around the books open and lively, and encourage your child to ask questions. If you don't know the answer to questions, explore more together through more books, web resources, hands-on activities, and local field trips. It's a great model for being a lifelong learner!

"Windows and Mirrors"

Books that reflect different cultures and family experiences will give your child a window into the diverse world we live in. Exposure to a wide range of books helps build both empathy and background knowledge— introducing children to different cultures and time periods will help them develop a broader understanding of the world around them. Other books give children a chance to see someone who looks like them as an empathetic character, hero, or important historical figure, contributing to a sense of self-esteem.



Nurtures a Love of Reading

When children are exposed to books and stories from a young age, they are more likely to develop a love of reading as they get older. That's because reading aloud helps them associate books with the joy of spending time with their parents and being read to in a warm and loving environment. And reading takes you places and teaches you things — you're dipping in and out of real and imagined worlds, meeting interesting characters, learning something new, or deepening an understanding of something you're already fascinated by.

Promotes Social-Emotional Development

Reading aloud can help your child develop social-emotional skills, such as empathy, understanding big emotions, and problem-solving. Many children's books explore topics such as friendship, conflict resolution, and dealing with difficult emotions. Sharing stories with children can help them learn how to understand and manage their own emotions, as well as how to interact with others in a positive and productive way. This is where conversations around shared stories are so important!

Strengthens Family Bonds

Reading aloud is a great way to bond with your child. It's a time when you can relax together, snuggle up, and share a story. It is also a great opportunity for parents and children to talk about the book, share their thoughts and feelings, and ask questions.
